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HILO, Hawai'i

Hilo is the oldest port of entry with a population of 38,000, and is the second largest city in Hawaii situated on the east coast of the Big Island (The Orchid Island). The Big Island is just that – BIG. It accounts for 63% of the state (about 4,000 square miles). Shipping and fishing business is significant, plus there's a campus for the University of Hawaii in Hilo. It is believed this was the first island to be inhabited by Polynesian voyagers from the Marquesas Islands, around 700 A.D. Hilo is America's wettest city, over 120 inches annually, and holds the record for the most rain in 24 hours (22.3 inches), set in 1979. Hilo is the gateway to Hawaii Volcanoes National Park, America's most exciting national park, where Kilauea Volcano has erupted every day since 1983.



KAHULUI, Maui

Maui is the most visited of all Hawaiian Islands. It is sparsely populated supporting less than one-tenth of the state's population. It is home to pineapple, sugar cane, cattle ranches, and rain forests. Kahului was a sugar town by 1880; however, real growth has only come during the last 20 years. Also of distinction is Haleakala, the largest dormant volcano in the world, consisting of 30,000 feet of hardened lava rising from the ocean floor capped by a huge crater. Maui is the second largest island in the Hawaiian chain. It is estimated that 50% of the world's humpback whales return to Maui's warm waters where they were born and to mate. Kahului is located on the northern coast of the island on Kahului Bay.



HONOLULU, Oahu

Geological evidence indicates Honolulu, Oahu evolved two million years ago after the formation of two separate volcanoes. King Kamehameha I (1753 - 1819) unified the islands under one rule and established his palace near what is now King Street. In 1866, Mark Twain said that every step in the city revealed a new contrast. At one time Waikiki was a swampy marshland of taro patches and rice patties. The land was reclaimed in the early 1900s. Tourism began when the first hotel was built in 1901, the Moana Hotel. Honolulu means, "sheltered bay" in Hawaiian. Honolulu has the only natural harbor in the islands formed by fresh water. Oahu is the third largest island in the Hawaiian chain and has two large backbone mountain ranges with green vegetation.



NAWILIWILI, Kauai

Kauai's first settlers arrived around 500 A.D., approximately 500 years before the rest of the islands were settled. Through a succession of kings, the island prospered. Captain James Cook landed on Kauai first, coming ashore at Waimea in 1778. Kauai is the smallest of the four major islands covering 552 square miles. Kauai is the oldest and most northerly of the Hawaiian Islands, famous for Waimea Canyon, the "Grand Canyon of the Pacific." Kauai's craggy mountains, gorgeous valleys, and many breezy beaches have managed to avoid excessive development. Much of Kauai looks just like it did when the first Polynesians paddled up to the shore. Of course, there are resorts, hotels, and some of the island's best golf courses, however, no building on Kauai is allowed to rise above the level of the coconut trees.

•POOL SAFETY

There are no lifeguards on duty at any of the pools. For the courtesy of all Guests, reserving sun loungers on Decks 9 and 10 is not permitted. For the health and safety of our Guests, parents must observe the U.S. Public Health Service requirements by allowing only children who are toilet trained to enter shipboard pools and spas. Children who are not toilet trained may use the splash zone area located near Mickey's Pool port side, swim diapers are required.

•SECURITY NOTICE

For the safety and security of all Guests when we visit ports of call, all individuals (including children) must have their Key to the World and adults must present a photo ID before leaving the ship. You must be 18 years of age or older to go ashore unaccompanied. Guests under the age of 18 may go ashore unaccompanied only by having a consenting parent, guardian or other responsible adult with them at the gangway to provide their signature as authorization, which will be good for the duration of that port day.

For the comfort of our guests the following areas are designated as Smoking areas: Open decks on the Starboard side (excluding Mickey Pool area).
